

the American dream?


And what about taxes? The Republicans want to preserve the tax cuts they gave to the rich, but instead they actually want to tax your health and welfare contributions. John McCain proposes to tax health benefits that exceed \$8,000 per year. That would impact all of our members. To top it off, the Republicans have opposed

any type of national health care and have no plan to deal with cost increases that are eating us up.

The Republicans have no interest in pension plans. To date, we have registered hundreds of our members and their families to vote in this election. But registration is only the first step—you actually have to vote! Once you do, call your friends and family and make sure they voted. Do your part to secure a better life for all working people.

Election action steps

Register to vote: The deadline is **Monday, October 20**. If you've moved since the last time you voted, you must re-register. Here's how to get a voter registration form:

- Ask your business agent.
- Most public offices (library, DMV, post office) have forms.
- Call 1-800-345-VOTE to request a form be mailed to you.
- Register on-line at: www.sos.ca.gov.

Request a vote-by-mail (absentee) ballot: If you have any doubt that you cannot get to the polls on time, request a "vote-by-mail" ballot in writing by Monday, October 27.

Get involved in your community: Union members can make the difference in key races. Contact your local Central Labor Council to find the perfect volunteer job for you—phone banking, precinct walking, stuffing envelopes, looking up numbers.


Vote: Election day is **Tuesday**, **November 4.** (Vote-by-mail ballots will arrive on or about October 5 and must be returned in time to be received by the elections official by election day or may be handed in at a polling place by 8:00 p.m. on **Tuesday**, **Nov. 4.**


